In compliance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC), Sai Nath University has constituted a Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Groups (SEDG) Cell to safeguard the interests of students belonging to socially and economically disadvantaged categories.

Objectives of the Cell

- To ensure equity, access, and equal opportunities for socially and economically disadvantaged students.
- To monitor and facilitate the implementation of policies and programmes for these groups.
- To provide guidance, counseling, and support to the students in academic and cocurricular activities.
- To organize awareness programmes, seminars, and workshops promoting inclusiveness and social justice.
- To create a platform for students to express their grievances and seek redressal in a fair manner.

Functions of the Cell

The SEDG Cell will perform the following functions:

- 1. Monitoring Admissions & Scholarships
 - o Ensure proper implementation of reservation policies in admissions.
 - Facilitate scholarships, fellowships, and financial assistance to eligible students.

2. Academic & Career Support

- Organize remedial coaching classes, bridge courses, and skill-development programmes.
- Provide special guidance for competitive exams, higher studies, and placement opportunities.

3. Counseling & Mentorship

- Provide academic, psychological, and career counseling for disadvantaged students.
- Develop mentorship programmes by assigning faculty mentors.

4. Capacity Building & Awareness

- Conduct workshops, seminars, and orientation programmes on social equity and inclusiveness.
- Celebrate important days related to social justice, equality, and empowerment.

5. Grievance Redressal

- Act as a nodal body for receiving and addressing grievances of socially and economically disadvantaged students.
- Coordinate with other grievance redressal mechanisms of the University.

6. Liaison with Government & Regulatory Bodies

 Ensure timely reporting and compliance with UGC/AICTE/State Government guidelines.

- o Maintain updated data of disadvantaged students and submit required reports.
- 7. Support for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)
 - Facilitate fee concessions, financial aid, and other support schemes for EWS students.
 - Identify deserving students and recommend them for institutional/ external financial assistance.
- 8. Promoting Inclusive Campus Culture
 - Encourage interaction and integration of students from diverse backgrounds.
 - Work towards eliminating discrimination, bias, and social barriers within the University campus.
